Background Information

Today, millions of children don't have access to essential services such as clean drinking water, education, health clinics, or hospitals. Whether they live in big cities or small rural villages, they can't enjoy their childhoods. They don't have time to grow-up, to go to school, or play without fear. Unfortunately a large majority of children have to work to survive.



First, the students will carefully examine the photos and look at the information section provided in order to understand the context of the images. Using these different elements, the student will try to put him- or herself in the place of a child labourer. They will then write a 250-word composition describing their thoughts and feelings about child labour in the world.
