## **Background Information**

One of the major causes in the difference of distribution of wealth between rich and poor countries is due to the unfair conditions of the international trade market. Why is it that workers in cocoa plantations in Ghana, working 7 days a week, 365 days a year and often more than 15 hours a day are not able to feed their families? These workers live in conditions close to

slavery. And why is the situation similar for workers in cocoa fields elsewhere in the world?



## Instructions

Have the students read the text on the everyday life of a young Ghanaian. Then have them write a short letter (200 words) to Brandon, the story's narrator, to express their feelings about his situation and to point out that things are changing with the fair trade system. Students will submit their letter to their teacher who may send them to the In-Terre-Actif Network so that they can be published on the Web site.
